The error is not in having the experience. The error is in literalizing the archetype: mistaking a psychological structure for an external metaphysical being who allegedly created the universe.

For atheists, Jung offers a different challenge: dismissing god entirely risks dismissing the archetype, which leaves the psyche without a symbol for wholeness. Jacques Lacan: God as the Name of the Structural Gap

Lacan's answer is the most structurally precise and the most uncomfortable for both believers and atheists.

For the atheist, Lacan's insight is sobering: atheism does not dissolve the structural gap. It merely removes the theological name for it. What replaces god in that structure — reason, science, the collective, Pure Awareness — determines whether deconstruction becomes liberation or merely substitution.

Three thinkers, one convergent conclusion for this article: Belief persists not because god exists but because the human psyche has powerful structural reasons to maintain the illusion.

The Non-Sequitur at the Core (FOQ-5)

As mentioned, this claim overlooks or deliberately excludes the possibility that everything exists eternally.

“2. The universe began to exist”

The Big Bang did not arise from nothing, but from a dense point.

Despite this scientifically accepted fact, Frank Turek uses big Bang as a “scientific proof” that universe has beginning, was created from nothing, and that god created it. That is not a science, that is just another religious manipulation, nonsense, and lie.

The second law of thermodynamics applies only to lower dimensions, and even then only as an assumption for shorter periods, since over longer periods the universe can heat up again. In higher dimensions, energy has no temperature, so the heating and cooling of energy does not exist.

Philosophical arguments against an infinite past are based on a false assumption about a cause-and-effect chain of events and overlook the possibility of eternity and simultaneity.

The contraction and expansion of energy occur only in lower dimensions; in higher dimensions, such phenomena do not exist. In reality, even in the lower dimensions, energy does not contract and expand; this is merely a characteristic of human perception, which is limited to a fraction of a second. Because of this limited view, it seems to us that things appear and disappear, while in reality they are constantly in their eternal place in Existence.

“3. Therefore, the universe has a cause

If the universe began to exist, then it must have a cause **outside** the universe.

This cause must be:

- **Timeless** (because time began with the universe)
- **Spaceless** (because space began with the universe)
- **Immaterial**
- **Powerful**
- **Personal** (to choose to create a temporal effect from a timeless state)

This is where the argument transitions from cosmology to metaphysics.”

Theists and apologetics never proved that God is a “necessary being”, that he is the “cause” of the universe, let alone that he is “timeless, spaceless, immaterial, powerful and personal” or “omnipresent, omniscient and omnipotent”.

If you have noticed the language trick claim: “This cause **must be**”, and not “This cause **is**”, which makes all the difference even for theists, if they would think about their own statements. They assume or even force – “must be”, that god exists, and then they believe their own manipulations and lies, forcing others to join them in their delusions.

The main characteristic of theological and apologetic “proofs” of God’s existence is the leap from (certain) assumption to (false) certainty. The first sentence starts with “if,” then continues with “must be,” and finally concludes with “is.” Translated into theological-apologetic delusion: “If God exists, then He must exist, and therefore He exists.”

This is not philosophy. This is **circular reasoning wrapped in metaphysical language**.

Simple and true answer to this manipulative assumption is: Universe never began to exist as it is eternal. That means that is was never caused, and it has no cause: God Does NOT Exist.

But, let’s check other theological claims which in fact themselves prove that god does not exist because that is not possible.

1. **Timeless:** Even if god existed, but he is not, and existed out of time, which is not possible, he would exist in eternal Now which is temporal term confirming that time exists.

2. **Spaceless:** If god existed, but he is not, he should occupied some space as Nothing can’t exist. Something is always somewhere, here, and here and somewhere are spatial terms.

3. **Immaterial:** The only phenomena that is truly immaterial is Pure Awareness which is a super-state. Everything else is energy-made or material – Energy=Matter. Every being must have at least energy body with the mind as energy organ for thinking, and in lower dimensions, physical body. Immaterial Pure Awareness is not a being, a person, let alone god, so god, if existed but he is not, should have at least energy body which is material body.

4. **Powerful:** Even if god existed, but he is not, that does not mean that he would be powerful, that is just a childish assumption.

5. **Personal:** If god would be personal, that would mean that he is a person. To be a person, he should have an energy or-and physical body, the mind, and personal identity, existing as energy material being in time and place. But, as I presented in first 4 paragraphs, such a creature exists only in the bible. God does NOT exists in reality because that is not possible.

William Lane Craig, a Christian “philosopher”, apologetic, and obsessive believer is modern defender and contemporary proponent of the Kalam manipulation. I put his title “philosopher” in quotation marks as the main point of philosophy is the **active and rational pursuit** of truth. Craig said that he would still believe in god even if presented with the valid evidence that god does not exist.

Craig states: "The way in which I know Christianity is true is first and foremost the basis of the witness of the Holy Spirit in my heart — this gives me a self-authenticating means of knowing Christianity is true wholly apart from the evidence." And: "Should a conflict arise between the witness of the Holy Spirit and beliefs based on argument and evidence, then it is the former which must take precedence over the latter." [Substack](#)

That is not philosophical stand, that is obsessive delusional faith. God does not exist, and that is a proven fact.
